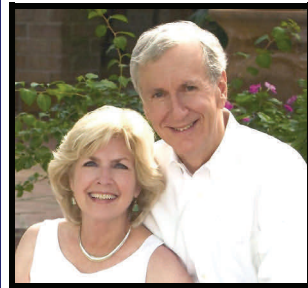

The History of Rotary Club of Corpus Christi

As the 70's concluded, the club continued to bounce around for meeting locations due to the conversion of the Driscoll Hotel to an office building and the demolition of our back up meeting location at the Nueces Hotel. We met at the Hilton Hotel, Master Host Inn on North Beach, the Holiday Inn Emerald Beach, Sheraton Marina Hotel, the Town Club, Yacht Club, Shrine Club, The Country Club and the La Quinta Hotel to name a few. In 1980 under the direction of President George Puls we signed an agreement to meet at the Bayfront Plaza Auditorium.

January 1980- we participated in the annual Tri-Club meeting where Texas Governor Bill Clements addressed the club on State, national and international interests. The Governor was most critical of President Carter's energy program and stressed that production, not conservation, should be studied as a solution to the country's energy crisis.

January 17th- "Health, Hunger and Humanity Benefit Art Auction" was held with President George Puls presiding. Roger Bateman introduced the auctioneer, Perry Berns, who opened the bidding on some 175 pieces of art from the Collier International Collection. Complimentary champagne was served by Turner Moller and his crew of "Masters." Total proceeds were in excess of \$10,000 with an estimated profit to the club of about \$1900. It was noted that our Club now had a membership of 295.

Col. Dusty Rhodes, Director of Engineering Services for the Port of Corpus Christi, updated the club on the activities of the Port. One item was that when Gulf State Oil Company new plant goes on stream in 1980 it would boost refining capacity to near 700,000 barrels per day.

Rotary International began 1980 with the celebration of 75 years of Rotary. In keeping with the celebration, the Club's Board selected Don Greene, President of Total Design Four to receive the Community Service Award for outstanding service in our city. In addition to many community services, Don was instrumental in founding "Leadership Corpus Christi" in 1972.

The Club had a bowling team, which included Bill Holland, Phil Wieland and Burke Graham and this week in February 1980 they won three of four games against Southside Rotary.

Celebrating the 75th Anniversary of Rotary International was our program on February 21st. George Puls presided, our own Luther Jones, acting in his official capacity as Mayor, read a proclamation that Thursday, February 21, 1980 be declared Rotary Day.

Roger Bateman presented a check to go to Rotary International for the Club's contribution from the Art Auction for the 3H (health, hunger and humanity) Program. Sam Gottlich introduced Franklin Yeager, club member and guest speaker for the day. He pointed out the great thing about Rotary is that once a week we can assemble with our friends and through fellowship, leave the hustle and rush and problems which surround us behind. He stressed the importance of each Rotarian taking part in Rotary activities "He who serves best, profits most." A special recognition was given to Lon C. Hill, honored as "Rotarian of the Century" by Harvey Weil.

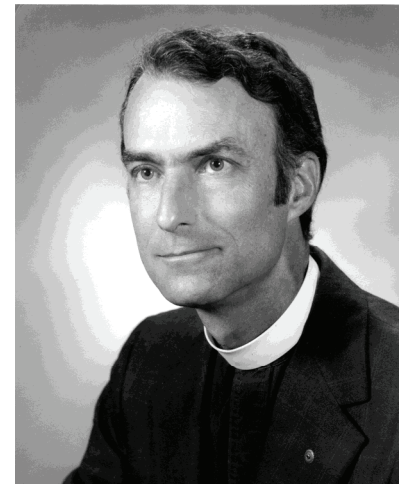
Since 1979 —299 clubs in 51 countries have been added.

Our own Johnny Lipes, Hospital Administrator, Memorial Medical Center, spoke to us on "Health Care in South Texas". He said that health care today can be regarded as too high in cost. Per day hospital room range from \$170 in Corpus Christi to \$325 in New York City. Due to federal regulations, \$31 is an average cost of paper work requirements per patient. He reminded everyone of the acute shortage of nurses and the effect on patients. (Wonder what he thinks of today's cost?)

George Dawson was inducted as 1980-81 Rotary President. He reported on the Rotary International meeting in Chicago which attracted some 20,000 Rotarians from around the world. He was particularly impressed with the international aspect of Rotary, and the fact that we are an association that is "doing things" for our communities and the world.
